### How we help families

We work with each family by identifying their **specific needs and goals** to reconnect parents with their children.

### This can include:

- Addressing alcohol and other drug use, mental health issues, family violence and safety planning
- Counselling
- Case management that connects families with any other services they might need
- Supporting parents at important appointments.

We can meet in our offices or a space that's comfortable for you.

# **Eligibility and referral**

Our program supports parents who are on Family Reunification Orders or Interim Accommodation orders in the Bayside (local government areas of Port Phillip, Stonnington, Glen Eira, Bayside and Kingston) and Frankston-Mornington Peninsula regions.
